The Bits & Bytes OHCE Group has been fortunate to continue their meetings. Due to the 2020 virus pandemic, the Extension Center received a mandatory shut down. The group ordinarily meets there on the 4th Monday afternoon each month from 1:00-3:00 in a classroom in the Conference Center.

The computer program "Zoom" has been used to bring the members virtually together from the comfort of sitting at home in front of their personal computers. Program handouts pertaining to the program demonstration to be presented are sent via email before the meeting. Bill James, one of six Regional Advisors from the Association of Personal Computer User Group (APCUG), is our instructor. OHCE DONATES VA BAGS

OHCE Genealogy members, Libby Hays, Molly Monaghan and Jo Ann Banse met at the Extension Center on July 1st to pack bags of personal items that were delivered to the VA Medical Center that afternoon. Unsolicited Seeds from China

Many of you have likely seen news reports of people receiving seeds from China that they did not order. In fact, over the weekend ODAFF received reports of Oklahomans receiving seeds in the mail from China. The seeds are sent in packages usually stating that the contents are jewelry. PLEASE be aware that unsolicited seeds could be invasive, introduce diseases to local plants, or be harmful to livestock.

If you receive unsolicited seeds from another country:

- 1) **DO NOT** plant them and if they are in sealed packaging don't open the sealed package.
- 2) This is known as agricultural smuggling. Report it to USDA and maintain the seeds and packaging until USDA instructs you what to do with the packages and seeds. They may be needed as evidence. The USDA Antismuggling Hotline is 800-877-3835 and their email is SITC.Mail@aphis.usda.gov. USDA will make every attempt to protect the confidentiality of any information sources during an investigation within the extent of the law.
- 3) For Oklahoma Dept. of Agriculture's records, please send us an email explaining your location and any additional information about the package to Morgan.vance@ag.ok.gov and Kenny.naylor@ag.ok.gov.
- 4) For additional information, contact ODAFF by calling Kaci Hubbell at 405-522-5971 or Joe Rackley at 405-205-2709.

NOTE: If you receive packets of seeds in the mail, please **DO NOT** throw them away. Bring them to the Extension Center and the Department of Agriculture will pick them up. They are investigating where they originated.
